## ***Annual Meeting: June 28, 2014*** by Kathy Wiggins

- The lake district, constitution and fishing committees will report to the membership at next year's annual meeting.
- The 2013 year-end balance was \$17,047.00.
- We have 156 members, including six new memberships.
- Dick Rankin, Steve Wagner and Steve Fleming's terms ended. Steve Wagner chose to run for another term. Kevin Springob, Joyce Warnacut and Steve Wagner were elected for a three year term. THANK YOU, Dick and Steve Fleming for your service to the Association.
- Eurasian watermilfoil: Only two small areas were found in the spring survey. They were either chemically treated or manually removed. EWM was discovered in the east lobe of the lake.
- Flowering rush: Two trial areas were treated with two different chemicals. Diquat had the better result. Research indicates it takes 3 to 5 years to deplete the rhizomes.
- Amanda Strick, the Oconto County Aquatic Invasive Species coordinator was a guest speaker.
- New business: Matt Marty spoke about the Oconto County Lakes and Waterways projects. Gary Miller wondered if people would like to write their cottage stories and put together a history of the lake.
- Dick Rankin was presented with a loon picture as a thank you for his service. Steve and Karen Fleming were presented with a framed Joan White print as a thank you for their contributions to the lake.

## ***Wisconsin Walleye Initiative*** by Betsy Nock

This year, Archibald Lake was selected as one of the 200 lakes in the state of WI to participate in the new WI Walleye Initiative. This project will plant larger walleye fingerlings in the 200 lakes. On Thursday, October 23<sup>rd</sup> the DNR, with the support of Eric Wegleitner, DNR Fisheries Tech, released over 5,800 6-8 inch fingerlings into the lake. More than 20 lake volunteers were on hand to assist. The pictures illustrate the procedures for that release.



First the large truck with the fingerlings arrived at the boat landing and Eric explained what we were to do. Larry Market is shown carrying fish from the truck tanks to water filled coolers on his pontoon. As each boat had their coolers, cans and pails filled, they left the boat landing and headed for designate spots in the east and west lobes of the Lake. You can see the release of some of these fingerlings in the deeper water of the east lobe and then as the remainder were released at the Boat Landing. Timing is critical for the fingerling release in order to decrease as much stress as possible for the transfer to lake water.

We would like to thank those volunteers who helped with this important project. They braved the elements and kept their boats in the water later than usual to help. ## ***Lake Ecology Team Update*** by Tim McGuire

The Lake Ecology Improvement Team has evolved from the Lake Fishing Improvement Team. We changed the name of the Team to better reflect what our Team is all about and what our Team is trying to accomplish. Yes, we want to improve fishing and the fish habitat on Archibald Lake, but our initiatives and projects affect more than just fish. Many of the projects that have been completed or are in the process of being worked on help the entire ecology of the lake, from plant growth, to the plankton that our newly hatched fish thrive on.

The WDNR has recently released more than 5800, 6" walleye fingerlings into our lake as part of the Wisconsin Walleye initiative. The plan is to release more walleye into our lake on even calendar years. We need to provide a quality environment in our lake to sustain their growth and to help in reproduction. To that end, the Association is planning to improve the rocky shoreline reefs in several areas of the lake. This will require permission from the land owners for us to place field stone in the lake bottom for the walleye to breed. If all goes well we will be placing rock on the ice near shore later this winter. If you are out and about during this time please feel free to lend a hand or give words of encouragement.

## ***Adopt-a-Shoreline / Lake Surveys*** by Kevin Springob

### **Adopt-a-Shoreline:**

This year we were fortunate to have complete shoreline coverage for Archibald Lake. Volunteers contributed a total of 136 hours in 2014. Thank you for all of your efforts. ### **Aquatic Plant Survey:**

The fall aquatic plant survey was conducted in September by the consulting firm Onterra. The survey crew found and removed a single plant of Eurasian watermilfoil in the west lobe of Archibald Lake. It is very likely that there are more plants that were not observed during the survey, but for now it is good news that we have significantly less Eurasian watermilfoil in Archibald Lake.



## ***Clean Boats / Clean Waters*** by Betsy Nock

This year, our 9<sup>th</sup> year of operation, we logged 152 hours of time at the boat landing. Although this total number was down from last year, we actually inspected more boats. Here are the numbers from the last 4 years.

We had good news about Eurasian watermilfoil on the west lobe of the lake, as reported in the Plant Survey article above. However, a patch Eurasian watermilfoil was discovered in the east lobe of the lake. Fortunately it was a small patch and it was hand pulled by Tim Counihan and Matt Marty. The same area was chemically treated for flowering rush, so hopefully the plants were eradicated.

### ***Flowering Rush Research*** by Kathy Wiggins

In addition to treating Flowering rush in the same areas as in the past, we expanded the treatment areas to two more places. One of the new places was on the east lobe of the lake. Please see the Annual Meeting slides (page 22) on our website for exact locations.

We spent \$8,349, with the most significant expenditures for aquatic plant management monitoring and treatment expenses. The balance in the Archibald Lake account stands at \$18,282 which is \$1,235 higher than we started out the year.
